

Hyderabad's popular fair 'Numaish' likely to reopen

HYDERABAD : Hyderabad's popular annual trade fair 'Numaish', which was abruptly shut down a day after inauguration on January 6 due to surge in Covid-19 cases, is likely to be reopened later this month.

With health authorities declaring that the third phase of the pandemic is over in the state, All India Industrial Exhibition Society, the organisers of the annual event, are planning to resume 'Numaish' from February 20-25.

As Covid curbs have been lifted in the state, the organisers have made a request to police and other authorities to grant permission for conducting the fair for one month.

A meeting of the society attended by some government officials was held on Wednesday to discuss the proposal. According to a member of the society, various departments have responded positively. The organisers are said to be waiting for final nod from police.

After receiving the permission from all departments concerned, the society will invite traders to again set up their stalls.

India's first mRNA vaccine under final trials: Dr V.K. Paul



NEW DELHI : India's first homegrown Messenger RNA (mRNA) Covid-19 vaccine, being developed by Pune-based Gennova Biopharmaceuticals, is currently under final clinical trials, NITI Aayog's Member, Health, Dr V.K. Paul, said on Thursday.

Briefing the media, he said that they are hopeful that they will be able to use

this vaccine soon. "We need mRNA platform because it has shown that vaccines developed on this platform, at least for Covid-19, have been effective worldwide," said Paul, adding that beyond Covid, this platform will continue to be important as an option for future for other diseases also for which vaccines have been elusive. He termed it as an

great development. Indian Council of Medical Research Director General, Dr Balram Bhargava, said that this is another vaccine which really establishes that India is heading towards becoming a vaccine super-power.

Covid infection rate declined significantly: Health Ministry

NEW DELHI : The Union Health Ministry on Thursday said that the rate of Covid infection spread has come down significantly in last some days. The country is reporting below one lakh Covid cases for last four days, said Lav Agarwal, Joint Secretary in the ministry.

"On January 24, the daily positivity rate was recorded at 20.75 per cent, which has now decreased to 4.44 per cent. It indicates that now the rate of infection spread has come down significantly," Agarwal said in a press briefing.

A total of 22,49,335 active cases were reported on January 24 which have been reduced to 65 per cent at 7,90,789 currently.

Further analysing the active cases status across the states, he said that only four states - Kerala, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka have more than 50,000 active Covid cases. Last week, there were eight states reporting over 50,000 covid cases, he said.

Similarly, total 11 states are currently reporting between 10,000 to 50,000 cases. However, 21 states have less than 10,000 active cases.

Across all states including Kerala and Maharashtra, decreasing trends are being reported in fresh covid cases and positivity rate, he added.

The number of districts reporting over 10 per cent positivity rate has declined to 141 across the country. Meanwhile, total 160 districts are currently reporting 5 to 10 per cent Covid positivity rate, Agarwal said.

Rajnath awards Defence Estates personnel for survey of 17.78L acres of land

NEW DELHI : For the first time post independence, the Defence Ministry successfully carried out survey of 17.78 lakh acres of defence land using modern technologies. Lauding the achievement, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has honoured 11 officers and 24 personnel of 38 Defence Estates Offices and four Assistant Defence Estates Offices.

Singh awarded the personnel of Defence Estates here on Thursday for their contribution in the successful completion of survey.

As per the records maintained by the Defence Estates Office, the Ministry of Defence owns about 17.99 lakh acres of land, of which 1.61 lakh acres of land is located within 62 notified cantonments across the country.

About 16.38 lakh acres of land is spread across many pockets outside the cantonments. Out of 16.38 lakh acres land, about 18,000 acres is either state hired land or is proposed for dele-

tion from records on account of transfer to other government departments.

The survey work of 17.78 lakh acres of land has been completed which is a significant achievement, as for the first time post independence the entire defence land was surveyed in coordination with revenue authorities of various state governments using the latest survey techniques.

Congratulating the award winners, Singh commended the Defence Estates personnel for completing the exercise in adverse weather conditions at uninhabited remote places, amidst the threat of Covid-19 pandemic.

He termed the survey as historic and exuded confidence that the clear demarcation of defence land will prove to be crucial for the security and development of these areas.

He added that the accuracy of the measurement of land and the reliable records born out of the survey will save considerable amount of energy, money and time that

goes into resolving land disputes.

Singh lauded the Directorate General Defence Estates (DGDE) for using drone imagery, satellite imagery and 3D modelling techniques in such a survey for the first time, which, he said, has made the results even more accurate and reliable.

The survey used modern survey techniques such as Electronic Total Station and Differential Global Positioning System. Drone and satellite imagery based surveys were also conducted to get accurate and time-bound results.

He underlined the importance of survey and land records, describing it as the basis of development in any area, state or nation.

"In the last 200-300 years, the knowledge of survey has played an important role in the journeys of those who managed to establish their dominance around the world. Therefore, it is a matter of

great satisfaction and happiness that today our country is moving forward in the field of land survey with modern methods, which will ensure protection of defence land and cantonment areas," he said.

Singh highlighted the important role played by cantonment areas in the socio-economic and cultural development of the country.

"Today, when the government proposes an allocation of Rs 173 crore in its budget for the construction of boundaries on defence land, it does not only mean financial grant, it also symbolises our commitment to

save and develop the cantonment areas. In this context, this survey was extremely important," he added.

Omicron Impact: 'Some loss' in economic activity momentum, says RBI Gov



MUMBAI : Covid's ongoing third wave has led to "some loss of momentum in economic activity" which has been reflected in high frequency indicators, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Shaktikanta Das said on Thursday.

He also pointed out that demand for contact-intensive services is still muted.

In his policy statement post the Monetary Policy Committee's bi-monthly meeting, Das said: "The MPC flagged the potential downside risks to economic activity from the highly contagious Omicron variant. Reassuringly, the symptoms have remained relatively mild and the pace of infections is moderating as quickly as it surged."

"There is, however, some loss of momentum in economic activity as reflected in high frequency indicators such as purchasing managers' indices for both manufacturing and services, finished steel consumption and sales of tractors, two-wheelers and passenger vehicles." Going forward, he said

India heading towards becoming vaccine super-power: DG ICMR

NEW DELHI : Director General of Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) Dr Balram Bhargava on Thursday hailed the 96 per cent nationwide COVID-19 vaccination coverage of the first dose and said that India is heading towards becoming a vaccine super-power.

The Messenger RNA (mRNA) vaccine is under phase 3 of clinical trials in India. This vaccine is expected to be of use in future for the treatment of other diseases as well. Addressing a press briefing, Dr Bhargava said, "India is heading towards becoming a vaccine superpower. The fact is that these vaccines are going to be available for other diseases." "Because such a large proportion of our population has been vaccinated, we are not seeing such a disastrous third surge in terms of hospitalisations and mortality that protection has been provided by the extreme 96 per cent vaccine coverage first dose and that I think is a major strength of the nation," he added. Highlighting the importance of the mRNA vaccine, Dr V K Paul, Member-Health, Niti Aayog said, "We need the mRNA platform because it's the new platform. It has been shown that vaccines developed on this platform, at least for coronavirus, have been effective worldwide." "This platform of vaccine is an asset today in wake of COVID, Omicron.

that positive impulses for quickening the pace of recovery emanate from buoyant 'Rabi' prospects, robust export demand, accommodative monetary and liquidity conditions, improving credit offtake, and the continued push on capital expenditure and infrastructure in the Union Budget 2022-23.

Furthermore, Das said that India's GDP is expected to grow at 7.8 per cent in FY2022-23.

Accordingly, the real GDP growth is projected at 17.2 per cent in Q1FY23, at 7 per cent in Q2, at 4.3 per cent in Q3 and Q4 at 4.5 per cent.

"In India, real GDP growth at 9.2 per cent for 2021-22 takes it modestly above the level of GDP in 2019-20. Private consumption, the mainstay of domestic demand, continues to trail its pre-pandemic level," he said.

"The persistent increase in international commodity prices, surge in volatility of global financial markets and global supply bottlenecks can exacerbate risks to the outlook."

In addition, Das said that going forward, the government's thrust on capital expenditure and exports are expected to enhance productive capacity and strengthen aggregate demand. "This would also crowd in private investment. The conducive financial conditions engendered by the RBI's policy actions will provide impetus to investment activity."
