

Within 6 months vehicles older than 15 yrs to be phased out

MI News Service, Kolkata: All vehicles older than 15 years in West Bengal will have to be phased out within the next six months, the National Green Tribunal (NGT) ordered on Tuesday.

The tribunal in its order said that the state government must ensure that the public transport vehicles below BS-IV (Bharat Stage) are phased out in the next six months so that only BS-VI vehicles ply after that in the state including Kolkata and Howrah.

"While phasing out the old vehicles, a move towards use of cleaner and greener technology with the introduction of Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) buses and electric buses may be expedited," stated the order passed by the NGT's eastern bench in Kolkata comprising Justice B Amit Sthalekar, judicial member and Saibal Dasgupta, expert member.

The major sources of pollution in Kolkata and Howrah are construction activities, burning of municipal solid wastes, vehicular pollution, road dust, and emission from hot-mix plants and stone crushers.

No inputs from Bengal on school curriculum: Centre

MI News Service, Kolkata: Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Telangana, and West Bengal are yet to send feedback on revising the National Curriculum Framework (NCF), the Centre said.

The NCF will be the bedrock of the new NCERT syllabus, and the textbook authority has sought input from the states to include changes.

The Ministry of Education in a written reply in the Lok Sabha said all states had sent inputs, barring three southern governments and West Bengal.

This is the fifth revision of NCF, incorporating suggestions from a large number of expert groups nationally and smaller panels at the state level.

The process is controversial as some BJP-ruled states have been charged with promoting saffronisation. The Karnataka government stands out as it was claimed that passages on Bhagat Singh were removed from the Kannada books.

The Centre claimed that the Karnataka government has clarified the chapter on the revolutionary freedom fighter has not been dropped.

Cops on alert after KLO release videos

MI News Service, Dinhat: Police are closely monitoring the movement of people along the interstate border of Bengal and Assam in the light of the back-to-back releases of videos by the Kamtapur Liberation Organisation (KLO), a banned terror outfit formed in Alipurduar in 1993.

In the past few weeks, Jeevan Singha, the self-styled KLO chief, had reportedly released three videos on social media, criticizing chief minister Mamata Banerjee and Trinamul all-India general secretary Abhishek Banerjee, and reasserting the KLO's demand for a separate Koch-Kamtapur state. Singha is suspected to be in Myanmar.

Police suspect the KLO, which was

inactive in recent years, is trying to regroup.

The outfit had indulged in terrorism around 20 years ago. In recent years, no major activity by it had been noticed.

"However, during the past few months, several trained KLO militants have been arrested. It was found that the outfit is recruiting youths again and is trying to extort money from the business community of this region. Now the outfit is releasing videos. That is why police and intelligence agencies are on the alert," the source added.

"There are instructions to see if anybody is moving towards the Northeast without a purpose. Re-

cently, there had been some arrests in the Northeast. Youths of north Bengal, who were reportedly going to join the outfit, were nabbed," a source said.

In north Bengal, over 500 former militants and linkmen of the KLO have returned to the mainstream. Among them are former close aides of Singha. Many are now serving as home guards in the districts.

Former KLO militants, asked about the recent videos, said they are waiting for peace talks. Last year, Himanta Biswa Sarma, the chief minister of Assam, had hinted that the KLO leadership was interested in peace talks with the Centre.

"We are in favor of peace talks as they can resolve our longstanding demand. We have returned to the mainstream and want him (Singha) to return," said Pulastya Barman, a former militant.

"We suspect the BJP is instigating the KLO to create tension in north Bengal. People here are not with them," said Girindranath Barman, district chairman of the party in Cooch Behar.

Nikhil Ranjan Dey, the BJP MLA of Cooch Behar South, rubbished Trinamul's charge. "Trinamul must remember that during BJP's era many such outfits of Northeast joined the mainstream via peace talks," he said.

"Our party and the central government always try to upkeep peace in any region," said Dey.

05626 Agartala - Howrah Special will leave Agartala on Aug 5 2022 (Friday) at 19:00 hrs. to reach Howrah at 14:00 hrs. on the 3rd day. 05625 Howrah - Agartala Special will leave Howrah on Aug 9 2022 (Tuesday) at 11:00 hrs. to reach Agartala at 05:45 hrs. on the 3rd day.

The train will stop at Bandel, Bardhaman, Bolpur Shantiniketan, Sainthia, Rampurhat, Dumka, Deoghhar, Banka, Bhagalpur and Monghyr stations over Eastern Railway system in both directions.

Booking of the above special train (05625) will be made available on & from July 29 2022 through PRS and internet. In addition to Mail/Express fare special charge will be realized. Concessional booking is not allowed. Tatkal quota is not available. Apart from unreserved coaches, the train will also have air-conditioned and sleeper class accommodations.

Bengal to take initiatives to make Malda Silk Park functional

MI News Service, Kolkata: The Silk Park that was inaugurated in Malda last year by chief minister Mamata Banerjee will soon be handed over to those who are associated with silk cultivation and production in the district.

On Tuesday, a meeting was held regarding the prospects of the Silk Park at Madhughat. The producers and entrepreneurs discussed a series of issues with officials of the district administration. They have demanded that the state government take initiatives to encourage private investments in the production of silk garments and apparel in the district.

Malda is as much famous for silk production as for mangoes. But the intrusion of Chinese silk has gradually affected the traditional silk industry in the district.

Those attached to the production of quality silk have switched over to other sectors. In 2009, the then Left government had sent a proposal to the Centre to set up a silk park to rejuvenate the silk production units in Malda.

"The central government accepted the proposal and under the national fiber mission, a silk park was planned in Malda. It was a joint venture of the central and state governments. The work of building the park started in 2013 and last year, the chief minister inaugurated the park," said Jufikar Ali, a silk producer in the district.

At the park, the east

block is ready and the west block is on the verge of completion.

Recently, the West Bengal Small Industries Development Corporation issued an advertisement, stating that 20 plots, measuring five kathas to nine kathas, would be offered on lease. The price per katha is Rs 80,000 and the lease will be for 30 years.

Similarly, 50 building spaces will be rented out at the park against a monthly rental of Rs 7,000 per square foot.

"The last date for submission of applications online is August 22. Those who will opt for plots or building spaces will be taken for a tour to explain the facilities. We are putting all efforts to make the park functional," Malda district magistrate Nitin Singhania said.

Along with the spaces, the park also has designated spaces for factories, common facility

centers, and warehouses. The administration also has plans to open a "silk haat," where garments made of silk will be displayed for sale.

"This is a commendable venture which will boost the silk industry in Malda. All facilities will be available under one roof. Rolling, cutting, coloring, and packaging of silk threads will be done here together. But we want the end product to be manufactured here. The silk threads produced in Malda are sent to other districts and states for garment production. We want garment units to come up here," Ali, the producer, said.

Abhijit Goswami, a deputy director of the state sericulture department, said: "Once the park is functional, we will take initiatives to bring in garment producers. It would also create an opportunity for residents of the district and surrounding areas to buy local silk products."

Greater Kolkata to have 10 more CNG stations by this fiscal end: Official

MI News Service, Kolkata: The greater Kolkata region will have another ten CNG stations by end of the current fiscal while in West Bengal as a whole, there will be 32 new such facilities, an official said on Tuesday.

The additional stations across the state will commence operations by end of March 2023, he said. Bengal Gas head operations and marketing P K Biswas said presently, there are seven CNG outlets in its command area that includes Kolkata Municipal Corporation locality, North and South 24 Parganas, and Hooghly districts.

Bengal Gas is a joint venture between Greater Calcutta Gas Supply Corporation and GAIL for gas distribution in Kolkata and adjacent areas.

Biswas said the company is now supplying CNG to Kolkata by bringing the gas through tankers.

Two more AC coaches to be attached with Amarnath Exp

Child injured in bomb blast

MI News Service, Farakka: A child was injured in a bomb explosion while playing with balls. The incident in Ratanpur area of Samsheganj. The injured child Suhana Sheikh has been admitted to the hospital. Two persons named Abdul Ghaflar Sheikh (42) and Roni Sheikh (19) have been arrested in the incident.

It is known that some trouble was going on between the neighbors in that area. Police of Samsheganj police station reached there after receiving the information. On seeing the police, some ran away. One of them had a bomb. He leaves two bombs on the railway tracks and escapes. Some children were playing nearby. As soon as the child picked up the bomb thinking

it was a ball, it exploded. Police later recovered several more bombs and bomb-making equipment from an abandoned house. The child's mother said that some people, including her son, were playing on the railway track. Thinking of the ball, he was returning home with the bomb in hand. It bursts on the way. Suhana was taken to Anupnagar Health Center with injuries. In this context, Bijan Roy, OC of Samsheganj police station, said that the bomb squad was informed. A total of 22 bombs were found. Police are investigating whether the bomb is stored elsewhere.
